Regular Meeting
Tuesday, February 10, 2026

Mayor Sarah Dove called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. at City Hall. Present for roll call were council members Bradley Hermanson, Deedee Olson, Dusty Pierson, and Teresa Dosch. Also in attendance were Jamie Green and Keith Winson, Laura Wanzek, and Rachel Markestad.

Rachel Markestad was present on behalf of the Beautification Committee. Discussion was held regarding the North and South welcome signs; bandstand landscaping, lighting, and the sidewalk leading to the bandstand; Pocket Park; and the 125th Celebration hanging flower baskets on Central Ave.

A motion was made by Dosch, seconded by Olson, to support the 125th Celebration hanging flower baskets, including labor by the City Public Works Department to water the flowers. The city will supply the watering wand. All voted yes. Motion carried.

Deedee Olson left the meeting at 6:55 p.m.

The council members each gave a portfolio report.

A motion was made by Dosch, seconded by Pierson, to provide city employees with a \$200.00 annual clothing allowance for work-related items, at the employee's discretion. Employees must submit receipts for reimbursement. All voted yes. Motion carried.

The Maddock Public School PTO requested a letter of support from the City of Maddock. The Council asked Pam to draft the letter.

The Council discussed complaints regarding a resident whose dogs are running at large, are unlicensed, and are barking, disturbing neighboring residents. The Council directed Pam to prepare a letter to be delivered by the Sheriff's Department.

A motion was made by Hermanson, seconded by Dosch, to approve a building permit for Kaitlyn Palacios. All voting yes, motion carried.

A motion was made by Pierson, seconded by Dosch, to approve a gaming permit for the Maddock Public School PTO. All voting yes, motion carried.

Meeting adjourned at 7:27 p.m. The next regular council meeting will be March 3, 2026 at 6:00 p.m.
